This restored stone fortress opens its gates to welcome you to frontier life. Enjoy the sights and sounds of the past. Hear musket fire, the cannon's roar and the fife's shrill tunes. The Fort's costumed guides demonstrate crafts, present historical skits and practice military drill and weapons firings.
